Responsible Visitors



Public Toilets - Public toilets are situated next to the ferry slip and near the Walled Garden in Achamore Gardens.

Recycling - Please use our recycling facilities by the ferry slip and glass bottle bank behind Gigha Hotel.

The roads on Gigha are narrow single-track roads with few passing places. Please drive slowly when passing through Ardminish village and when approaching corners. There is a car park at the ferry slip and at Achamore Gardens. Please avoid parking in front of farm gates, access points, residential homes, or locations that will damage our verges.

Responsible Camping

Location - Please do not camp in enclosed field of crops or farm animals, or near buildings, and please park considerately.

Waste - Please leave no trace, and ensure human waste is either buried or disposed of appropriately.

Lighting Fires



To protect our local surroundings, use a stove rather than light an open fire. If an open fire is necessary, keep it small and supervised. Never light a fire during prolonged dry periods, in woodlands, on peaty ground, or near to buildings. Please remove all traces of fire before you leave.
